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INTRODUCTION

About OIC

The Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) (formerly Organization of the Islamic Conference) is the second largest inter-governmental organization after the United Nations which has membership of 57 states spread over four continents. The Organization is the collective voice of the Muslim world and ensuring to safeguard and protect the interests of the Muslim world in the spirit of promoting international peace and harmony among various people of the world. The Organization was established upon a decision of the historical summit which took place in Rabat, Kingdom of Morocco on 12th Rajab 1389 Hijra (25 September 1969) as a result of criminal arson of Al-Aqsa Mosque in occupied Jerusalem.

About SESRIC

The Center was established in pursuance of Resolution No.2/8-EC adopted by the Eighth Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers, held in Tripoli, in 1399H. (1977). It is a subsidiary organ of the OIC. The Centre started its activities in Ankara on 1 June 1978.

The basic mandate drawn up for SESRIC is threefold:

- To collate, process and disseminate socio-economic statistics and information on and for the utilisation of the member countries,
- To study and evaluate the economic and social developments in the member countries to help generate proposals that will initiate and enhance co-operation among them, and
- To organise training programmes in selected fields geared to the needs of the member countries as well as to the general objectives of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation.



ABOUT WORKSHOP

In line with the "Strategic Plan for the Development of the City of Al-Quds" and the selection of the Al Quds Al Sherif City as the OIC City of Tourism 2015, SESRIC has decided to organise a two day workshop on "Exploring Tourism Potential of Al Quds Al Sherif City" in Istanbul, Republic of Turkey on 24 and 25 November 2015.

The objective of the workshop is to provide the participants an opportunity to deliberate and to exchange views, knowledge and expertise with a view to determining ways and modalities for tapping into the tourism potential in Al Quds Al Sherif City and formulating concrete recommendations for action at the OIC level. - Examining and discussing the challenges and obstacles as well as the prospects for enhancing the development of tourism in Al Quds Al Sherif City;
- Exchanging and sharing knowledge, experiences and best practices in the tourism sector that can be applied to Al Quds Al Sherif City;
- Exploring feasible and implementable ways and means for collaboration among government entities,
 OIC institutions and the private sector to support the development of tourism sector in Al Quds Al Sherif City.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Currency and ATMs

The official currency of Turkey is Turkish Lira (TRY). All payments on the territory of Turkey must be done in TRY. The local banks and exchange offices in Istanbul provide foreign currency exchange service. But it will be hard to exchange money during the meeting hours due to the meeting schedule. Hence, we strongly advise you to use foreign exchange facilities of the airport. It is also possible to use the ATMs located in banks, hotels, large shopping centers.

Credit Cards
